Winter Jobs

Now that the colder weather and shorter days are with us many of you will be spending more time indoors getting ready for Christmas.

If you do go to your allotment to collect winter veg or to clear your patch, now is a good time to remove or burn rubbish, mend path edges or complete your winter digging. Organic matter can be dug into the soil now and compost heaps can be turned and mixed with fresh manure.

Now is a good time to check any leftover packets of seed you may have. Check the dates on the packets and any that are more than three years old should be thrown as they may not germinate

Winter is also a good time to tidy up sheds and tool boxes, some structures on the site are an eyesore and cause complaints, if yours is one, please deal with it before you have to be told.

Please remember that bonfires must not be left unsupervised and that rubbish must not be dumped on neglected plots or in the car parks. A group of volunteers have recently cleared rubbish and quite a few brambles from the car park at Tomswood.
